# EVERY DAY LASTS A YEAR

**A JEWISH FAMILY'S CORRESPONDENCE FROM POLAND**



Following his parents' death in an automobile accident, Richard Hollander cleaned out the family home. In a leather briefcase, he discovered a collection of letters written to his father by his mother and sisters pleading for him to rescue them from German-occupied Poland. Unbeknownst to Richard, his father Joseph was himself during these years in legal limbo: The United States would not accept him as a refugee and threatened to deport him time and again. Even his most valiant efforts to save his family failed, but the letters endured and provide a most vivid and

original portrait of life in German-occupied Cracow before the deportation.

Richard Hollander will speak on his family's story and his new and important book, which will be available for purchase.
